What is a carbon footprint? The calculation of the carbon emissions you produce, as a church or individual, is known as your carbon 'footprint'. A carbon footprint not only takes into consideration the energy used to heat and light your home, but includes travel and where we invest our money, whether we have a few pounds or many. It is helpful to understand your carbon footprint in order to make reductions in your carbon emissions. There are a number of free carbon footprint calculators available for individuals and households such as the [WWW Carbon Footprint Calculator](#) and [Climate Stewards 360°](#) carbon tool. This will form an important baseline measure, the first time you complete it. By calculating your carbon footprint each year you can make comparisons and see progress on your carbon reduction. *Why not make this your New Year Resolution?*
